Just one of many stories of perfect strangers helping one another during Omaha's recent tragic weather events.

Keep Omaha Beautiful Program Highlights







Thanks to support from the Papio Missouri River Natural Resources District, Keep Omaha Beautiful was able to continue successfully implementing Tree Canopy Improvement plantings, stream cleanups, water pollution prevention education, and trail cleanups.

Tree Canopy Improvement Program



The Papio-Missouri River NRD allocated \$20,000, which was used for multiple tree plantings throughout FY23. These funds played a crucial role in procuring trees and ensuring their care through watering contracts under the *Trees for Omaha* program. Planting sites encompassed eleven parks, one public pool, and one boulevard. In a collaborative effort, 51 volunteers assisted in planting 63 trees during a community event at Fontenelle Park in the Fall of 2023.

Stream Cleanup Program



The Papio-Missouri River NRD allocated \$7,000 toward organizing volunteer efforts aimed at conducting cleanups in streams and adjacent areas in order to prevent litter pollution from entering our waterways. Volunteers were also tasked with installing "no dumping" decals and distributing 2,330 educational door hangers to households across the city. The NRD funding was essential in purchasing supplies for stream cleanups, storm drain marking, covering staff time, and acquiring educational materials.

The Papio-Missouri River NRD provided \$3,000 of funding for trail cleanups. These funds were used to coordinate volunteers to complete cleanups along trails throughout Omaha. This funding also helped to purchase supplies and supported the cost of staff time to scout trails and recruit, coordinate, and train volunteers.
