RE: Nikolas Erosion and Sediment Control Complaint

The District received a Nebraska Erosion and Sediment Control Act complaint form from Michael Nikolas on February 20, 2024, at our Omaha Office.

On March 1, 2024, I met with Michael Nikolas at his property at 12115 N. 36<sup>th</sup> St. Mr. Nikolas and I inspected his property and looked at the gully erosion that he is experiencing. Erosion was noted but sediment damage was not present.

I explained to Mr. Nikolas that, per the District's Erosion and Sediment Control Program parameters, sediment damage must be present for the complaint to be applicable.

A letter was mailed to Mr. Nikolas on March 8<sup>th</sup> explaining my determination. The complaint and results of the investigation have been reviewed by District legal counsel to verify the recommendation as it pertains to the Nebraska Erosion and Sediment Control Act.

Staff recommends the Subcommittee recommend to the Board dismissal of this complaint due to the fact that this complaint is a non-violation of the District's Erosion and Sediment Control Program.

Michael,

On March 1, 2024, I met with you on your property to evaluate the erosion that is occurring. After walking the area and witnessing the erosion, it appears that it is typical erosion from runoff that is originating from your adjacent neighbors. The location of your property is an urban/residential area that is under the jurisdiction of Douglas County and the City of Omaha.

The Erosion and Sediment Control Program applies to areas that are farmed and are in agricultural setting. This act would only apply if the adjacent farmer was using tillage practices that would exceed 5 tons per acre of sediment that would be causing damage to their downstream neighbor.

After the evaluation, it is my opinion that your situation would not fall under these criteria since it is in an urban setting and that there are no farming operations taking place.
